Top Tips

A healthy self-esteem is one of the building blocks of resilience in young people. The way we speak to them and about ourselves - shapes how they view themselves. Over time, this becomes their inner voice, making it essential to lead by example.

Tip of the week: Model the confidence you want your child to feel

When you show self-acceptance and speak positively about your own challenges, you teach your child to believe in themselves. Young people with healthy selfesteem feel capable, valuable, and more prepared to take on life's challenges.

C Try this: When your child takes on something new or challenging, say, "I love how brave you are for trying this!" Pair it with statements about your own growth, like, "I'm proud of myself for learning something new today too."

By modeling self-confidence and encouraging your child to see their own value, you're helping them build resilience and set the stage for healthy relationships and behaviours as they grow.
